#### **Dear Colleagues**

It's October already and as we approach the heart of Spring, Melburnians are feeling grateful to see a decrease in the number of active COVID-19 cases. Given this trend, we have seen some easing lockdown restrictions in Victoria.

In this newsletter I am pleased to announce that from the promising 267 assessors' expressions of interest reported in the last newsletter, we have received 170 submissions from 39 institutions at the close of the nomination phase on 25 September 2020. The final count represents a drop of 7.6% submissions from last year.

We have also been fortunate to recruit 165 assessors who are volunteering their time to review the submissions. This year, we are holding two zoom briefing sessions with the assessors: the first on 2 Oct to outline the assessment process, and provide some assessment tips following the assessment matrix criteria; and a second briefing session, on 8 Oct to explain how to use the awards portal for assessment. The assessment phase will take place in the next three months.

As per previous years, we aim to continually improve the AAUT process, and act on the feedback gathered from all our stakeholders. The ICO evaluation survey is now open so we encourage our ICOs to complete the evaluation survey and provide their valuable feedback.

Finally, I wish to share with you the news that I will be leaving Swinburne University of Technology after almost three years to take up a new and exciting executive leadership role as Associate Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Learning and Teaching), College of Science, Engineering and Health, at RMIT University commencing in January 2021. The AAUT awards team will join me, and we will keep you posted with further developments.

Assessors will meet via Zoom to agree on final ratings and feedback.

#### Step 4: Awards Committees Endorsement

The Awards Committees will be responsible for confirming and endorsing the ratings.

#### Step 5: Universities Australia (UA) Board

UA Boards of Directors will sign-off by the final recipients list.
