AWARD TYPES

- Citations for outstanding contributions to student learning (Citations) are a smaller scale award that recognise and reward the diversity of contributions made by individuals and teams to the quality of student learning.

- Awards for Programs that Enhance Learning (Program Awards) recognise learning and teaching programs or services that make innovative and outstanding contributions to student learning and/or the quality of the student experience.
- Awards for Teaching Excellence (Teaching Awards) recognise Australia's most outstanding university teachers or teaching teams who have demonstrated excellence, leadership and sustained commitment to teaching and learning in higher education.
- Awards for Australian University Teacher of the Year is awarded to one Teaching Award recipient, who has an exceptional record of advancing student learning, educational leadership and scholarly contribution to learning and teaching.
- Career Achievement Award is occasionally awarded to one or more individuals who is recognised for the impact they have had on the higher education sector and whose achievements had a major influence and left an enduring legacy.

Each nominee is required to prepare a submission consisting of a written statement and relevant supporting documents. <u>Institutional Contact Officer (ICO)</u> is responsible for the online submission of all nominations for their institution.
