If there are four group awards there could be eleven individual awards.</p>	<p>\$20,000 for groups and \$10,000 for individuals</p> <p>The selection panel will decide the number of awards within the total scholarship fund of \$200,000.</p> <p>Awards of \$20,000 are awarded for a group award and \$10,000 for an individual award, with provision for:</p> <p>a) two or more Kaupapa Māori Awards.</p> <p>b) two or more Le Moana Mua Awards.</p> <p>c) one Prime Minister’s Educator of the Year Award (with an additional \$10,000 grant), awarded to the nominee or group whose portfolio the panel agrees best exemplifies the overall criteria.</p>	<p>General Individual &amp; Group Awards</p> <p>The Kaupapa Māori Award is for educational practice that incorporates te reo Māori, tikanga Māori, and mātauranga Māori.</p> <p>Le Moana Mua award recognises the outstanding practice of Pacific Educators</p>	<p>Overall, the panel will be looking for evidence that nominees:</p> <p>a) are strongly focused on evidence of sustained contribution to and impact on learner success, and the subsequent impact on whānau, communities, and employment outcomes.</p> <p>b) have learners with their whānau at the centre of education. Outline how you have high aspirations for every learner, design and deliver education that responds to their needs, and sustains their identities, languages and cultures.</p> <p>c) have barrier free access for all learners including Māori, Pacific Peoples, neurodiverse, disabled and those with learning support needs.
