ABOUT EARLY CAREER AWARD

In 2004, the Early Career Teaching Award was introduced for teachers with less than five years' experience teaching in higher education institutions. To be eligible, the five years is calculated from the start of their teaching to the date of submission, that is from August 2018 to August 2023. AAUT allows for interruptions such as unemployment, maternity or parental leave, and medical conditions. This will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
