

1. Finalise nominations

For each nomination, ensure all required documents are combined into one PDF file (no more than 15MB) in the required order (refer to Nomination Instructions).

2. File names

Ensure the file name of each PDF nomination and photo is saved in the correct convention, e.g. ANU_KING.P_2023CIT.PDF and ANU_KING.P_2023CIT.jpg

3. Upload your nominees' submissions

Log into the Awards Portal with your unique Account ID and password to upload your nominees' submissions. For more information, read the full 2023 Awards Portal Nomination Instructions with annotated screenshots. NB: Maximum submissions per institution apply.

The allocation of assessors will depend on the number of nominations we receive - the Awards Team will get in touch with you by the end of September to confirm if you are selected.
