

AAUT EARLY CAREER AWARD

In 2004, the Early Career Teaching Award was introduced for university educators with less than five years' teaching experience. To be eligible, the five years is calculated from the start of their teaching to the date of submission, e.g., from August 2019 to August 2024. AAUT allows for interruptions, such as unemployment, parental leave and medical conditions. This will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. The recipient of the Early Career Award can be an individual or team who has received a:

- Citation for Outstanding Contributions to Student Learning that recognises and rewards the diversity of contributions to student learning in higher education ; or
- Teaching Excellence Award that recognises university teachers or teaching teams who have demonstrated excellence, leadership and sustained commitment to teaching and learning in higher education.
