HOW TO APPLY



Speak with your Institutional Contact Officer (ICO) to learn about the nomination process at your institution. The ICO is responsible for the online submission of all nominations for their institution.



Review the Nomination Guidelines and Assessment Matrix thoroughly



Prepare all requirements for submission:

- Teaching Awards Nomination Form
- Claims against Assessment Criteria (8 pages)
- Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- 2-3 minute video
- Team Statement of Contribution (if applicable)
- Two letters of reference
- Supporting materials
- Digital Photograph

Submit to your ICO by institutional deadline.
