

AAUTN Mentor Scheme

The <u>AAUTN Award Mentor Scheme</u> draws on the skills and experience of the AAUT Teaching Award winners. The scheme has two distinct themes:

- Advice and support for aspiring award nominees on the development of their AAUT nominations.
- Mentoring for recent recipients of the national Teaching Excellence awards.

To date, there are 57 registered mentors from 21 institutions, who have volunteered to act as mentors for future awards applicants. We also have three new mentors from the 2023 program including:

- 2023 Australian University Teacher of the Year A/Prof Zala Volcic from Monash University
- 2023 Neville Bonner Award recipient A/Prof Kerry Bodle from Griffith University
- 2023 Teaching Award recipient A/Prof Sarah Cresswell from Griffith University

We encourage aspiring nominees for the 2024 AAUT program to utilise this invaluable 'self-serve' system: Mentees choose a mentor from the list and approach them by email. Please be mindful that mentors' workloads and responsibilities will fluctuate - they may already be 'booked', or personal circumstances may reduce their availability.
