### ASSESSMENT KEY DATES



Before commencing, assessors attend or watch the recorded sessions about the assessment process.



Assessors review their team's comments in preparation for the collaborative assessment.

Assessors individually review their assigned nominations against the assessment criteria.



Assessors come together into their allocated teams of three to discuss the ratings and written feedback, and moderate their assessments.

At this stage, we are only seeking your expression of interest to assist in this process. The allocation of assessors will depend on the number of nominations we receive by mid-September. **Please note** that you are not eligible to assess if you have submitted a nomination this year.
