achievements of the 2024 AAUT recipients in their region—see some of the highlights in the photos below.


We're also excited to announce that the full lineup of presenters for the AAUT

Finally, thank you for your continued patience as we finalise arrangements with Universities Australia for the 2025 AAUT round. Stay tuned—more updates are on the way!






Breakfast Series

achievements of AAUT recipients and promote innovative teaching practices and programs within the academic community.




