

Professor Jessica Vanderlelie is the Deputy Vice-Chancellor Academic at Deakin University, where she leads strategic initiatives in education and employability. A nationally recognised higher education leader, she is an Australian Learning and Teaching Fellow, and a recipient of both Citation and Teaching Awards. Jessica is a strong advocate for diversity, inclusion, and bold, Al-driven transformation in universities. She urges the sector to move beyond being "a content business" and to embrace personalised, equitable learning at scale. She has been a valued member of the Awards Committee since 2021.

Professor Kylie Readman is Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Education and Students) at University of Technology, where she leads initiatives in teaching, learning, and student engagement with a strong focus on equity and wellbeing. Previously at Murdoch University, Kylie brings extensive experience in educational leadership and innovation. She began her career as a teacher and has secured over \$1.2 million in research funding to support student success and teaching excellence.

Emeritus Professor Nicolette Lee is the former Deputy Vice-Chancellor Education at La Trobe University. 
