IFNTF “Symposathon” April 16-17, 2026

Optimising Teaching Excellence: *The Way We Work | The Way We Learn*

The International Federation of National Teaching Fellows (IFNTF) is pleased to host its fourth virtual “symposathon” (Symposium + Marathon) in April 2026.

This is the seventh annual international summit/symposium held by IFNTF. The IFNTF First World Summit in 2017 in Birmingham, UK, featured the theme *Defining Teaching Excellence across Disciplines*. The IFNTF Second World Summit in Halifax, Canada, in 2018, was themed *Nurturing Teaching Excellence across Disciplines*. The IFNTF 2021 Symposium held in conjunction with the Canadian STLHE conference featured *Shaping Teaching Excellence across Disciplines*. In 2022, IFNTF held its first “symposathon” themed *RE-Shaping Teaching Excellence: Pandemic and the New Now*. The second symposathon themed *Augmenting Teaching Excellence: Embracing the future of education with AI and Emerging Technologies* was held in December 2023. The third symposathon themed *Transforming Teaching Excellence for the future* was held in December 2024.

The IFNTF 2026 Symposathon will bring together educators, fellows, students, activists, researchers, administrators, and thinkers to explore the deep changes underway in higher education.

This year we address the question: *In a world of collapsing models, rising automation, shifting trust, and intensifying metrics — what does it mean to “optimise” education?*

This isn’t just a theme. It’s a pressure point. A question of whose futures we’re building, what values shape our systems, and who gets to decide how we teach, learn, and work.

We invite submissions on these main (but not limited to) thematic areas:

Theme A: What Does “Optimising” Education Really Mean?

A meta-theme: asks what we mean by optimisation, for whom, with what values, and what getting optimised might leave out.

Theme B: Work & Academia — Labour, Value, and Transformation

Explores how academic labour is changing: models of work, value extraction, invisibility of care, shifting reward systems.

Theme C: Institutional Disruption & Business Models in Higher Education

Focuses on how business/logics of universities are evolving: revenue, scale, outsourcing, market pressures.

Theme D: Politics, Autonomy & the Academic Public Sphere

Looks at freedom, surveillance, regulation, public trust, culture wars impacting education.

Theme E: Automation, AI & Re-thinking Teaching and Learning

Examines the impact of AI, data, automation on teaching models, credentialing, student/teacher roles.

PAPER SUBMISSION

We welcome submissions for paper sessions. Papers can be theoretical, conceptual, and/or empirical. Authors should submit an extended summary limited to 1500 words (excluding references). Papers should be related to the key theme of the conference and the key task areas.

Submissions are welcome from all educators. However, at least one of the co-authors of each paper must be eligible for full membership at IFNTF. That is, **at least one of the co-authors must have received a National Teaching Fellowship in their home country.**

SYMPOSATHON TIMINGS

- Eastern Time (Toronto/New York): Thu 16 Apr, 5:00 – 7:00 PM (EDT)

Time Slot 3: Australia & New Zealand focus

- Perth: Fri 17 Apr, 7:00–9:00 AM (AWST)
- Auckland: Fri 17 Apr, 11:00 AM–1:00 PM (noon) (NZST)
